

ONE VISION, ONE IDENTITY, ONE COMMUNITY



- Attaining peace and stability in Southeast Asia
 - General absence of an armed conflict in Southeast Asia as ASEAN's most important contribution
 - Role of ASEAN principles and the ASEAN Way
 - ASEAN Member States' history of resolving disputes peacefully and with respect for the rule of law

- Facilitating national and regional economic development
 - The absence of armed conflict has provided an environment conducive to economic growth and development
 - ASEAN economic integration has opened opportunities and has also allowed other members to catch up and become connected to the regional and global economy.


- Improving the lives of the peoples of the region
 - ASEAN as a people-oriented and people-centered region that puts the lives and welfare of the peoples as a priority.
 - The ASEAN Community Vision and Blueprints encourage Member States to adopt national policies and programs toward the attainment of regional objectives and commitments
 - ASEAN facilitates capacity building and technical assistance for Member States




- Facilitator of regional dialogue and cooperation
 - ASEAN has managed to engage all regional players through a web of bilateral and multilateral mechanisms
 - ASEAN as a 'driving force' of regionalism by encouraging external powers to subscribe to the same ASEAN norms and principles

Challenges

- Coping with the evolving regional security architecture
- Responding to non-traditional security concerns vis-à-vis ASEAN Way
- Institutionalization: form over substance?
- Addressing bilateral tensions
- Building national resilience and addressing development gaps
- Building an ASEAN identity: less top-down approach



A retrospect of ASEAN's journey in the past five decades reflects its positive contributions to the region and to its people.
